Stories and Songs from Wales in Hill End

Sharing stories and songs in English and Welsh, three performers from the UK's acclaimed Adverse Camber will be guests for a special performance at **Hill End's Royal Hall on Saturday May 4 at 3pm.**

The storytellers are spending two weeks in the NSW Central West as guests of Arts OutWest and Bathurst Memorial Entertainment Centre (BMEC).

Alongside small local performances they'll run storytelling workshops, connect and share stories with local communities and restage their bilingual show 'Dreaming the Night Field' at BMEC.

In Hill End performers Michael Harvey (Storyteller), Lynne Denman (Singer) and Stacey Blythe (Composer/Musician) will present an intimate afternoon of traditional and reimagined Welsh stories.

Enjoy one of Wales' most engaging storytellers alongside exquisitely haunting live music. English and Welsh are artfully woven together to make these ancient voices and living landscapes come alive.

"Arts OutWest has developed a relationship with Adverse Camber over the past few years and are very excited to be bringing these exceptional performers to the region and for audiences to enjoy their unique storytelling skills," Arts OutWest executive director Tracey Callinan said.

Tickets for the Hill End performance are \$10 at the door.
