Free grant writing workshop for the arts

Learn how to tap into arts funding at a free workshop in Orange on Monday 16 June.

Arts OutWest is presenting a one-day insight into the world of arts funding as part of their ongoing support of arts and cultural development across the Central West.

Arts OutWest executive officer Tracey Callinan will offer insights, advice, information and support. Ms Callinan has many years experience managing funded arts projects and organisations both here and overseas, has her own strong track record of successful funding applications and has been on funding assessment panels for some of the major arts funding bodies.

The workshop will cover how funding works, what is currently available, how to develop a strong project for a funding application and how to put your application together.

“I’ll cover areas that often trouble first time funding applicants like budgets, project planning and gathering appropriate support materials. People also appreciate getting an insight into how a funding panel actually works,” Ms Callinan said. “I’m happy to talk through people’s project ideas with them to help find a good funding fit for their ideas.”

Major upcoming arts funding programs include the NSW state government’s Arts NSW Arts and Cultural Development Program and the federal Regional Arts Fund as well as the suite of opportunities provided by the Australia Council for the Arts.
